



Vaccinations - Starting on November 08th, all students traveling to the US **must be fully vaccinated**. This means that if you are going home for winter break, then you must be fully vaccinated if you wish to return to Truman to continue your studies.

Which Vaccinations? - Vaccinations that have been approved by the FDA and by the WHO for Emergency Use are acceptable. This includes the Pfizer, Moderna, Johnson & Johnson, AstraZeneca, and Sinopharm vaccinations. Click [here](#) for a complete list.

Proof – You must present proof of vaccination to the airline before boarding your plane.

Negative COVID-19 test – Incoming fully-vaccinated travelers must also take a COVID-19 test within 1 day of traveling to the US and show a negative result to the airlines before boarding the plane.

I-20/DS-2019 – As always, your I-20 or DS-2019 must be endorsed for travel by Matt or Melanee in the Center for International Students.



Exceptions – Some countries are exempt from the requirement to be fully vaccinated. Some of these countries are Egypt, Ethiopia, Ghana, Mali, Nicaragua, Nigeria, Togo, Uganda, and Yemen. For the complete list, click [here](#) and search for Table 4.

Quarantine – If you are not fully vaccinated, then you must quarantine for seven (7) days when you arrive in the United States. Again, this means that if you are going home for

winter break and are not fully vaccinated before you return, then you will be required to quarantine when you return to the US.

Vaccinations – If you are not fully vaccinated, then you will be required to get vaccinated within 60 days of your arrival in the US. This is mandatory.

Negative COVID-19 test – If you are not fully vaccinated, then you must also take a COVID-19 test 1 day before traveling and show a negative result to the airlines before boarding the plane.
